Advancing nearshore protection and restoration

FINAL 2013 INVESTMENT PLAN

Effective July 1, 2013 – June 30, 2015

The Estuary and Salmon Restoration Program (ESRP) provides grant funding and technical assistance for shoreline restoration and protection projects in Puget Sound. Managed by the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife in partnership with the Recreation and Conservation Office, ESRP advances projects that best meet the objectives of regional recovery efforts including the Puget Sound Nearshore Ecosystem Restoration Project and the Action Agenda.

ESRP routinely develops Investment Plans to guide funding decisions. Our final 2013 Investment Plan directs state capital funds to projects during the 2013-15 biennium. These plans were developed through a competitive, sound-wide process and results in a ranked list and funding recommendations.

INVESTMENT PLAN DEVELOPMENT


The 2013 Investment Plan is the culmination of several months of project solicitation, evaluation and analysis. Projects were competitively solicited and evaluated by a multi-disciplinary, multi-agency technical review team resulting in a ranked list of restoration and protection projects and a separately ranked list of learning or monitoring projects. New this grant round was a required pre-proposal phase and in-person presentations to the technical review team for projects selected to submit full proposals.

- 51 pre-proposals received \$33 million requested
- 43 full proposals received \$26 million requested
- 37 projects recommended for full or partial funding \$15 million requested from ESRP

Projects received one of three primary recommendations (full fund, partial fund or defer/pass) based on feedback from the technical review team, ESRP staff and the PSNERP Steering Committee. This final draft of our Investment Plan includes projects recommended for full or partial awards. Projects not recommended for funding have been removed from the project list.

Projects included in the Final 2013 Investment Plan:

This map identifies the location of 29 projects recommended for funding and those within the current funding range. Projects below our funding level will be offered awards in sequential order if/as additional funds become available. Final award amounts may vary from funding recommendation as a result of contract negotiations.



Note: Six learning or monitoring awards associated with projects or multiple project sites are also recommended for funding but not displayed separately here.

FUNDING AVAILABILITY

ESRP awards may consist of state or federal funds or a combination of state and federal funds as indicated.

State funds - \$10M appropriations received (funding supports projects and program administration) Effective July 1, 2013

<u>Federal funds</u> - \$2.3M in-hand Effective date Jan. 8, 2012

EPA funds were awarded to beach restoration projects that address shoreline armoring. Eligible shoreline restoration projects were evaluated by an additional review team based on ESRP rank as well as a small number of additional criteria (opportunities for innovative

restoration; public access and outreach potential, long-term protection and ability to decrease demand for future armoring). These funds are made available through collaboration with WDFW/<u>DNR's Puget Sound Marine and Nearshore Grants Program.</u>

The 2013 Investment Plan will be used to guide ESRP funding decisions related to allocation of state capital funds for the 2013-15 biennium. Projects will be funded in sequence down the project list with the exception of projects selected for EPA funding as described above. Pending funding availability, ESRP may elect to solicit portfolio proposals in 2014 or solicit new projects if additional partnership funds become available. All awards will be managed by the Recreation and Conservation Office.

FUNDING NOTES AND CONTINGENCIES

Smith Island Estuary Restoration

This award is contingent upon securing PSAR (or other funds) necessary for implementation by March 30, 2014. Pending review at that time, ESRP may choose to redirect funds to projects further down the ranked list if implementation does not seem likely in near future.

Smuggler's Slough Adaptive Management

The Scope of Work for this project should include review of culvert design by WDWF fish passage technical staff. Future requests for Smuggler's Slough should come through the new project competition not the portfolio process. The current scope of needed actions is not defined clearly enough to justify the portfolio process.

Seahurst Park North Shoreline Restoration

A partial award level of \$1.28 million coupled with requested PSAR funding would enable sponsor to undertake construction even in absence of Corps funding. This partial award is contingent upon securing PSAR (or other funds) necessary for implementation by March 30, 2014. Pending review at that time ESRP may choose to redirect funds to projects further down the ranked list if implementation does not seem likely in near future.

This project was also selected to receive an EPA of up to \$817,000 although the sponsor is currently not certain whether they would be able to meet matching requirements if federal, rather than state, funds were award. Should the sponsor be able to accept these federal funds, the state award of \$1.28 million will be reduced accordingly and the state funds made available for projects further down the project list.

Edgewater Beach Restoration

Funding for this project which proposes shoreline armoring removal on private lands is contingent upon securing an agreement from the landowner which would preclude future armoring from being installed.

Lyre River Estuary Restoration

The majority of property proposed for acquisition in this project is upland. While the need to protect uplands is acknowledged it is well beyond the scope of the ESRP which is limited to the nearshore. ESRP funding should be limited to acquisition of the nearshore portions of the project defined to include an adjacent buffer along the shoreline and up-stream to the head of tide.
